The following plays were produced by the First Year Students Project Class: "Soul Gone Home," "Papa's Daughter," "The Trysting Place," "Bury the Dead," "Shut-Up, He Explained," "The Future Is in Eggs," "The Graduation," "Let Us Entertain You," "A Tale of Two Kingdoms," "The Class Reunion," "Curley," "The First Nine Months Are the Hardest,"

"Impromptu," "The Man Who Married a Dumb Wife," and "The Purification."

The Ethnic Theatre in cooperation with Community Services presented "In White America," "Te Ata," and "El Teatro Campesino"; the Theatre Arts Department in cooperation with the Student Body presented "Glorious Ghetto."

Last summer a Children's Theatre was started and played 38 performances to an audience of over 5,000 children. The children were bussed to the Theatre from the city playgrounds by the Youth Services Department.

The Theatre Arts Department gave a benefit performance for the Martin Luther King Jr. Scholarship

fund; hosted the Annual National Thespian Society Regional Workshop Conference, the Los Angeles City Theatre Arts Teachers' Association Fourth Annual Play Festival, and one day for the National Conference of the United States Institute of Theatre Technology.

The Theatre Arts Department's production of "The Way of the World" was selected by the First National College Theatre Festival to be presented in Ford's Theatre, Washington, D.C. The competition consisted of 192 entries from the 50 states, and ten were selected for presentation in Washington. "The Way of the World" received outstanding reviews and national acclaim for our department.
