



LACC Korean Program Info for High School Students

1. Start here if you never applied nor attended a college within the Los Angeles Community College District (LACCD), including Los Angeles City College

2. Even if you already have your LACCD Student ID #, you must still fill out the [Supplemental Application for Admission of Students in Grades K-12](#) form every term before the student will register for a class. It requires a signature from a parent or guardian and a high school official so PLEASE plan 3 weeks ahead and submit it at least 3 weeks before the start of instruction. A student CANNOT register for a class before both the application and supplemental application are processed by the Admissions.

3. When the parent/guardian signs the form, s/he must fully understand that the son/daughter will be treated as an adult in class and must be accountable for all academic responsibilities including course registration and withdrawal by deadlines.

FOR PARENT/GUARDIAN: I authorize my son/daughter to enroll in a college level course in the LACCD. I understand that my child will not be afforded any special status or supervision as a result of his/her minor status while enrolled in the Los Angeles Community College District; I also understand that I will not have access to my child's student records (including grades and transcripts) without his/her written consent, his/her minor status notwithstanding.

4. LACC Korean 1: Elementary Korean is equivalent to 2 years of high school language study.

KOREAN 001 - ELEMENTARY KOREAN I

5 Units (Lec 5 Hrs)

Transfer Credit: CSU (CSUGE Area C2), UC (IGETC Area 6A)

Elementary course for students without prior exposure to Korean. Develops speaking, writing, listening, and reading skills in Korean at the ACTFL Proficiency Novice-Mid Level, and introduces Korean culture. Corresponds to the first two years of high school Korean.
