

In order to comply with the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health Officer Emergency Isolation Order issued April 1, 2020 for the control of COVID-19, the LACCD EOC has issued the following recommendations with regard to possible COVID-19 exposure:

1. A person is considered to be a close contact of a person with presumed or confirmed COVID-19 if, within 48 hours before that person's symptoms began and until that person is no longer required to be isolated, they (a) were within 6 feet of a person with presumed or confirmed COVID-19 for more than 10 minutes or (b) had unprotected contact with the body fluids and/or secretions (such as being coughed on/sneezed on, shared utensils, or saliva or provided care without wearing protective equipment) of a person with presumed or confirmed COVID-19.
2. Employees who are **known to have had close contact** with a person presumed or confirmed COVID-19 are to be sent home to self-monitor and quarantine for 14 days following the last contact with the sick employee. Quarantine leaves related to COVID-19 will be applied for up to 14 days. During the quarantine leave, no employee shall go into less than full paid status if illness days are insufficient to cover the leave period.
3. If employees or family members become symptomatic, they are to immediately seek medical treatment and notify their supervisor as soon as reasonably possible.
3. Employees who were in general areas that were identified as locations the person presumed or confirmed COVID-19 had visited, need only to self-monitor as there was no direct contact or prolonged exposure to the person with presumed or confirmed COVID-19. But it is recommended that the employees who request be allowed to go home and telecommute (or voluntarily self-quarantine if they are not able to telecommute).
4. Employees who have had contact with a coworker who has been told to quarantine as a result of close contact with a person presumed or confirmed COVID-19, need only to self-monitor and advise if they become symptomatic. But it is recommended that employees who request be allowed to go home and telecommute (or voluntarily self-quarantine if they are not able to telecommute).
