Course Description & Student Learning Outcomes

Course Description

Completes the elementary Korean grammar; includes the reading of elementary texts, emphasizes written composition and the spoken language.

Advisory

English 28 or equivalent.

Student Learning Outcomes

Compose an oral skit in Korean and perform it in front of the class to be evaluated on content and creativity. Sustain a conversation in Korean for 7 minutes on various everyday topics and/or in a particular situation.

Criteria

Write and converse in Korean at a functional level on various topics with knowledge of Korean culture, grammar (using both polite informal form and deferential style in past, present, and probability tenses), and a wide vocabulary. Both the conversation and writing should employ noun modifications, clausal connectives, and different sentence endings to reflect fluency. Accurate pronunciation and spontaneity in conversation.

Rubric

Exemplary: Both writing and conversation show synthesis of all the speech styles, tenses, noun modification, clausal connectives, and sentence endings with almost no mistakes. Commands an extensive vocabulary. Enunciation is clear and responses and com-

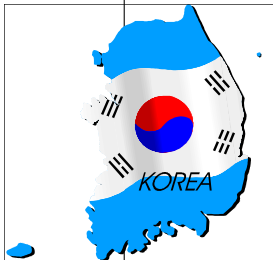
ments are quick.

Acceptable: Both writing and conversation show some synthesis of all the speech styles, tenses, noun modification, clausal connectives, and sentence endings with some errors. Commands good vocabulary. Enunciation is comprehensible and responses and

comments are filled with some pauses.

Unacceptable: Both writing and conversation show no synthesis of all the speech styles, tenses, noun modification, clausal connectives, and sentence endings with

constant mistakes. Commands limited vocabulary. Enunciation is incomprehensible and responses and comments are not returned to continue a conversation.
