- Presentation techniques—such as PowerPoint, Panel, Roundtable, Group Activity, Lecture, etc.

Your cover sheet must include the following information:

- Title of presentation
- Name and position title of presenter
- Institutional affiliation
- Mailing address
- Email
- Phone number
- Specific audio/visual requirements
- Preferred room arrangement and size (classroom, group tables, theatre rows, computer lab, etc.)
