Student Lounge

Soon LACC students will be able to re-energize in a real lounge! Architects for the project, TMAD Taylor Gaines and our construction manager Harris & Associates are working through plans to get drawings submitted to and approved by the State's Division of State Architect (DSA) this month. The LACCD Board of Trustees is also expected to approve the plans and specifications, which should jump start construction to begin in June. Additionally, we are currently working on selecting an operator for our new Coffee House. If all goes well, we expect to finalize the selection process sometime this month, which means by the fall - it will be lounging time!

The Child Development Center just north of Franklin Hall is 65 percent complete. The exterior plaster has been applied and carpeting is being installed. Projected completion is set for this December just when little voices are learning holiday carols!

Martin Luther King Jr. Library

This year marks 40 years since Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. delivered his famous "I've Been to the Mountaintop" speech and many special events have taken place to mark the anniversary. This summer, LACC will also honor the legacy of Dr. King by hosting the grand opening of our newly-renovated library. Currently, the library is 90 percent complete. All furniture and equipment has been procured for the building and installation has begun. The official ribbon-cutting ceremony is scheduled to take place this fall.

Parking Structure/Athletic Field

The Parking Structure/Athletic Field is 78 percent complete. The cement for the bleachers is being poured and the passenger elevators are being installed. On Saturday, May 31st, a helicopter will lift the exterior light poles for the Athletics Field to position them for installation.
