## Los Angeles City College Articulation Agreement 2015-2016


#### Abstract

The following courses taken at Los Angeles City College will transfer to the University of Redlands School of Business in fulfillment of the requirements for the Bachelor of Science in Business and Bachelor of Science in Management Degrees. Students must complete 120 academic semester credits with a minimum 2.0 GPA. A minimum of 9 of these credits must be earned at the upper-division level (see your School of Business Student Services Manager for upper-division courses). Only grades of 2.0 (C) or higher will transfer.
