

The aims of this national theater education program are to identify and promote quality in college-level theater production. To this end, each production entered is eligible for adjudication by a regional KC/ACTF representative. The production is also eligible for inclusion at the KC/ACTF regional festival. Eight KC/ACTF regional festivals are produced nationwide each year, and from these festivals up to six productions are selected to be part of the noncompetitive KC/ACTF national festival at the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts each spring. KC/ACTF also sponsors regional and national level awards, scholarships, and special grants for actors, playwrights, designers, and critics.

Last year more than 800 productions and 17,000 students participated in the Kennedy Center American College Theater Festival nationwide. By entering this production, our department is sharing in the KC/ACTF goals to help college theater grow and to focus attention on the exemplary work produced in college and university theaters across the nation.
