Low-Cost Internet (Wi-Fi, Broadband) Options for Students

Emergency Broadband-WiFi Benefits

Students can begin applying and enrolling TODAY for Emergency Broadband Benefit, an <u>FCC</u> <u>program (https://www.fcc.gov/emergency-broadband-benefit-program</u>) which helps families and households (including students) to afford internet service during the COVID-19 pandemic. Eligible households are able to enroll in the program to receive a monthly discount off the cost of broadband service from an approved internet provider. **Only one monthly service discount and one device discount is allowed per household.**

If your household is <u>eligible</u>, you can receive:

- Up to a \$50/month discount on your broadband service and associated equipment rentals
- Up to a \$75/month discount if your household is on qualifying Tribal lands
- A one-time discount of up to \$100 for a laptop, tablet, or desktop computer (with a co-payment of more than \$10 but less than \$50)

There are three ways for eligible students/households to apply:

- **Contact your preferred participating broadband provider** directly to learn about their application process (some providers are listed below), and/or
- **Go to <u>GetEmergencyBroadband.org</u>** to apply online and to find participating providers near you, and/or
- **Call 833-511-0311 for a mail-in application** and return it along with copies of documents showing proof of eligibility to: Emergency Broadband Support Center, P.O. Box 7081, London, KY 40742.
