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LACC RECEIVES \$2.9 MILLION GRANT TO FOCUS ON CREATIVE TECHNOLOGY

(September 22, 2020) – Los Angeles City College (LACC) was named the recipient of a U.S. Department of Education Title IV "Focus on Creative Technology Grant." The five-year \$2,991,602 award begins October 1, 2020 and will provide stimulating and engaging options to connect minority and low-income students directly to their career interests.

The new grant will fund dual enrollment, a new Center for Innovation & Technology, supplemental instruction and community internships. The combined areas will improve retention, persistence and attainment of certificates, degrees and transfers.

"We are extremely grateful for receiving this important grant," said Dr. Mary Gallagher, president of Los Angeles City College. "The funds will help us in our efforts to provide student centered education focusing on our communities unique skills, abilities, interests and talents."

For the over 3,000 high school students in dualenrollment classes through LACC, the grant will fund classes for 500 students at various landmark cites throughout the city rather than at participating high schools. The new Center for Innovation & Technology (CIT) will be a planned gathering space where faculty, students and the community can create and develop projects and products using nontraditional hands-on methods. The makerspace will be specifically designed to enhance learning and collaboration within the STEM and Arts subjects for low-achieving students. The CIT is planned to open when students return to campus. Supplemental Instruction will include tutoring focusing on collaboration,

group study and interaction to assist students in traditionally difficult courses. Community internships will provide workshops and unpaid internships and field trips for students in the fall term of their second year. Professional seminars will also be provided as well as paid internships at worksites related to student majors.

The grant includes \$20,000 annually for an endowment that will be matched by the LACC Foundation, resulting in a \$200,000 total endowment to benefit future students.
