Certificate programs currently offered include English as a Second Language (ESL), Academic Preparation, High School Equivalency, Customer Service Skills, Hospitality, Career Discovery Skills, Job Readiness, Vocational ESL, Child Development Readiness, Health Careers Readiness, Retailing Smarts, In-Home Supportive Services Skills, Workforce Literacy Skills, and Workplace Success.

The program offers free noncredit courses and certificates with opportunities for individuals to gain lifelong skills for career advancement, educational growth and skills to successfully acquire and retain employment in high-demand occupations.

New certificate programs include Introduction to Computers, Computer Skills for the Workplace, Technology for Success in the Workplace, Entrepreneurship Skills, Guestroom Attendant Training, Banquet & Restaurant Server Training, and Technical Office Occupation. New Classes include Spanish for the Workplace, Medical Terminology, and Computer Courses including: Introduction to Keyboarding and Windows for the Workplace, Word Processing, Spreadsheets, Multimedia Presentations, and the Internet.
