KENNEDY CENTER AMERICAN COLLEGE THEATRE FESTIVAL (KCACTF) AT CAL STATE UNIVERSITY FULLERTON

two performances at LACC on Feb. 6 and 7

The Los Angeles City College (LACC) Theatre Academy has won a rare spot to perform its production of *The Sandstorm* at the Kennedy Center American College Theatre Festival (KCACTF)'s Region VIII Festival on the Cal State University Fullerton campus on February 11-15, 2020. The play, performed by Academy students and directed by LACC Theatre Academy's Head of Acting, Louie Piday, includes a series of vignettes based on playwright Sean Huze's experience during his tour of duty fighting in Operation Iraqi Freedom. Huze joined the Marines days after September 11 and the World Trade Center attacks. After serving as a corporal deployed to Iraq as a rifleman from Kuwait to Bagdad, Haze returned home from active duty in 2003 and could not find justification or meaning for the war he served in. Ten days after his return, he starred *in The Sandstorm*, his debut play.

The *LA Times* called the play "a heart-clutching eye witness mosaic" of "shocking force and awesome honesty."

In anticipation of touring to the Region VIII Festival, the Theatre Academy will be remounting *The Sandstorm* Thursday, February 6th and Friday, February 7th at 7pm.
